REFLECTION

On the 5th Sunday of Lent the Gospel passage shows us two kinds of sinners. First there is the woman who was caught in the act of adultery, a serious matter. But the Scribes and Pharisees are also sinners, totally lacking in the compassion which God expects of his followers: *"Be merciful, as your Father in heaven is merciful."* The Scribes and Pharisees are proud and arrogant, giving themselves the prerogative to sit in judgment on others. They do not know how to love, to forgive - only how to keep the Law. But how many of us would have acted differently in this case?
