Reflection from Father Henry

In the Gospel this Sunday a certain scholar wanted to go to heaven or inherit eternal life, so he asked Jesus, *"What I must do to gain eternal life?"* And in reply Jesus asked him: *"What is written in the law?"* And the lawyer recited the famous **Shema**. But Jesus made him realise that gaining eternal life is more than lip service. Jesus took the opportunity to remind him that the sure ticket to heaven is to put into practice the greatest commandment of love. The commandment has two faces, love of God and love of others.

We should love God above all but the commandment does not stop there. Jesus is asking us to further concretise our love for God by loving our neighbour. And conversely, there is no authentic love of neighbour which does not spring from God, for otherwise it is a refined, subtle form of self-love.

Jesus is our model of what it means to love God and neighbour. His life depicted what love of God and neighbour is all about. Our neighbour is anyone in need, especially the unlovable. Everybody therefore is our neighbour.

The Conclusion of the second General Assembly of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia, 3-9 July

This week, the final General Assembly of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia was held. At the assembly, the 277 Council Members considered the motions that emerged from that national journey, with the goal of renewing the life and mission of the Church in Australia.

The Council has released a series of documents that declare the motions and the voting outcomes for the four sessions that were held. These documents can be downloaded from plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au. In August this year, the Council will finalise and release the Acts of the second General Assembly and accompanying discussion of the way forward for the Church in Australia.
