#### REFLECTION FROM FR RASS

A Facebook post goes something like this: "If you think going after the one lost sheep while leaving the ninety-nine in the wilderness is illogical, it will not be if you realise that YOU are that one lost sheep. The gospel for today tells us that Jesus as the good shepherd is willing to leave the ninety-nine sheep behind to go after the one lost sheep. This only shows how Jesus loves every sinner who have lost their way. He will rejoice over the one repentant sinner. In the longer version of the gospel is a beautiful story of the prodigal son. In this story, the merciful father extends his mercy to his son who left the house and went on to live a life of debauchery, only to come back when he is about to die of hunger. Yet, the elder son who is not impressed by the actions of his younger brother is being pleaded by his father to accept his brother again. Will we also be forgiving to people who have offended us? Will we be humble enough to ask for forgiveness to our Father whom we have offended grievously?


## Safeguarding Sunday 2022 - September 11

We recommit to cultural change that will help the Church be a place where people feel safe and supported. The **Season of Creation** is a period that brings together the entire Christian community worldwide to pray and take action for the care of the environment. It begins on September 1 with the **World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation** and ends on October 4 with the



feast of St. Francis of Assisi. It was established by Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I, in 1989, when he proclaimed September 1 as the Orthodox Day of Prayer for Creation. Years later, the World Council of Churches (WCC) extended the celebration to October 4, the day on which **St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of the environment**, is celebrated. For his part, in 2015 Pope Francis made the Season of Creation official for the Ro-

man Catholic Church. <u>"Listen to the voice of creation"</u> is the theme and invitation of this year's Season of Creation.
