REFLECTION FROM FR HENRY

The Gospel story this Sunday provides us all with an opportunity to look at what is most important in life. The rich man had all he wanted in this life but clearly lacked charity on account of the fact that he ignored the physical needs of Lazarus. For that reason, the rich man was spiritually impoverished, whereas Lazarus was spiritually prosperous.

The key to this story is that even though Lazarus was in a miserable physical condition, his soul was in the hands of God. We know that to be true, because we are told that when he died, he was "carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham."

The reading invites us to keep our eyes on what is really most important in life, namely our spiritual wealth, thus see the hardships we endure in our lives less burdensome. Perhaps we will never be in the same physical condition as Lazarus, but we may encounter other great pains and hardships in life. When this happens, the tendency may be to become fixated upon those sufferings and to take your eyes off your interior union with God.

If you (or someone you know) answers YES to any of these questions, you are invited to find out more through a process called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

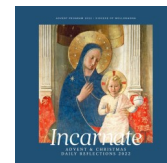
The first meeting will be held on **Thursday, 6th October 2022 at 7.00pm** in the Parish Meeting Rooms under the church.
