SUNDAY REFLECTION

In the Gospel for the first Sunday of Lent we read that "Jesus remained in the desert 40 days and 40 nights, tempted by Satan." Lent is traditionally a time of fast, penance, almsgiving. The idea most of us were given about Lent is that it is a time to "give up" something. On the contrary, Lent is a time of "DOING" something to change our lives and the world around us. Our FAST is not just fasting from food but fasting from jealousy, anger, hatred, and all the other attitudes in our lives that keep us from truly loving God and our neighbours. It is probably easier to fast from food when we have an abundance of food. Yet it is harder to change our attitudes about people around us. PENANCE is our willingness to change and be changed by God's spirit alive in us. Penance is not just saying prayers but living a life prayer in all that we do. ALMSGIVING is our awareness of the needs of others who search for life, love, and help in their times of need.

Echoing the words of Pope Francis, who in his homily on Ash Wednesday 2019, said to us that Lent is "the time to rediscover the path of life, because on the path of life what really matters is not to lose sight of the goal."

As we enter this Holy Season of Lent, let us ask the Lord for the Grace to start it with our eyes fixed on Him and the path of life He lays out for us amid temptations. As the Gospel of today reminds us that Jesus remains steadfast, never once giving into temptation, and this gives us an example of how we can trust in the Lord, our God.
