SUNDAY REFLECTION

The readings for the 5th Sunday of Lent are about how God can take us from death to new life. The first reading tells us of God's desire to bring us back to life. The second reading tells us if Christ dwells in us, we will have new life as He does. And the gospel tells how Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead.

We believe that, as with Lazarus, death isn't the end. Because we are a people rooted in God's love at the end of our earthly life we return to God. We know we are called to new life. We hear Jesus say in the gospel: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." This belief is often what gets us through a season of

grieving. It gets us through the moments when we wonder what is next. We know and we believe in the resurrection.
