REFLECTION

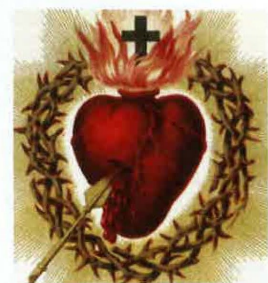
There is the old adage “you are what you eat” – which is intended to convey the message that it is important to eat good food to be healthy. There is some truth in this when it comes to the Eucharist. If I believe that the Eucharist is the Body, Blood and Divinity of the Lord Jesus, it should do something to the way I live my life. Do I believe in what I am receiving so that my heart is moved with love when I receive the Lord?

In the Gospel Acclamation for the Celebration of Corpus Christi this year we hear a beautiful verse from the Gospel of John: “I am the living bread that came down from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live forever” (John 6:51). The verse highlights that Jesus’ presence in the Eucharist is for life. For the Gospel of John eternal life is not only for the end of life, but it is something we share in already. So also Jesus’ presence in the Eucharist leads us to ever greater life of communion with God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - a life that we can know each time we pray before the Blessed Sacrament or receive the Holy Eucharist.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is a celebration of the greatest gift of Jesus’ presence in the Eucharist. In the Eucharist, our offerings of bread and wine are transformed into God’s own gift of Jesus’ Body and Blood. The gift of the Eucharist is for life. May we deepen our love of the Eucharist so that we may share in God’s life more and more and make it visible in our world.
