#### REFLECTION

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Holy Trinity, the feast of our God manifested in three persons, the Father, Son and the Spirit. In our practice of Christian Life, the Trinity is remembered often in prayer and during the daily routine by every Christian. Each time we make the sign of the cross, as we did at the beginning of this Sunday Mass, we say: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." In the second reading of today Paul reminds the people of the Father's love, the grace that comes through Jesus Christ and the fellowship or the unifying power of the Holy Spirit. The intimate relationship of love between the Father, Son and the Spirit is described in various places in the Gospel of John.


"For God loved the world so much..," says St John in a famous line. There has never been a more radical statement in the history of humanity.
