REFLECTION

The readings for this Sunday are focused on the Kingdom of God. The first reading reminds us that God desires justice and has shown us the way of kindness. The second reading tells us that the Spirit aids us in our weakness. And in the gospel Jesus gives us several parables related to the Kingdom of God, including the parable of the weeds in the wheat, the parable of the mustard seed, and the parable of the yeast.

Jesus presents the reality that in this world, both believers and unbelievers will coexist until the final judgment, highlighting the presence of evil and the challenges faced by believers in a fallen world.

The parable depicts the ongoing spiritual battle between good and evil, illustrating the strategies of the enemy to sow deception and hinder the growth of God's kingdom. The parable emphasises God's patience and long-suffering, as He allows both the wheat and the tares to grow together until the harvest, symbolising the delay of final judgment and the opportunity for repentance.

In the gospel for this Sunday Jesus teaches that the kingdom of God will expand and grow, starting small but eventually encompassing many people, cultures, and nations, reflecting God's plan for the expansion of His kingdom.


