

REFLECTION

The readings for this 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time are calling us to do the work of the Kingdom of God with the gifts we have been given. In the gospel Jesus tells the parable of the talents and praises the servants who used their resources wisely.

By giving us life, God has also provided us with the possibilities for growth and development. It doesn't matter if one has much or little; what matters is that what we have received has yielded some profit. The man in our parable, who hides his talent for fear of the master, has not known how to take risks: "But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's Money". Maybe the core of the parable is this: we must conceive a God that motivates us to go beyond ourselves, who encourages us to live freely for the Kingdom of God.

The passage emphasizes the importance of wisely managing resources or gifts given by God. Each servant in the parable is held accountable for how they use their talents, highlighting the theme of personal responsibility. It also suggests that there will be a time of reckoning where each individual will be judged based on their actions.
