Reflection

17 December 2023

The third Sunday of Advent is called 'Gaudete Sunday' which means 'Rejoice'. Today, on our Advent Wreath we light our pink candle to mark this day of joy. And why should we be rejoicing? Because we are soon to remember that the Son of God, Jesus the Christ, came to live among us as a human

We rejoice because He the Lord brings such Good News. Part of the first reading, from the prophet Isaiah, will later be used by Jesus, to confirm his identity: "The spirit of the Lord God is upon me because the Lord has anointed me..." In so speaking, Jesus clearly identifies himself with the anointed king who is the Messiah and Saviour of God's people.

The Second Reading continues the theme of joy that comes to us through Jesus. "Rejoice always" may

seem a rather unreasonable demand. Yet, for the true Christian, happiness is the underlying experience of daily living, even if, now and then, there are painful problems to be dealt with.

A key to our enduring happiness is an unconditional openness and humility to where God leads us and a readiness to speak out and act boldly in his name. In this we have the example of John the Baptist in our Gospel reading this Sunday. Jesus is the light, (not John,) and John is a witness to the light.

As we prepare to celebrate Christmas and the coming of God into our lives through Jesus, we need also to remind ourselves that we have been called to be the means to bring Jesus - the light into other people's lives.
