Reflection

On this first Sunday after Christmas, the Liturgy invites us to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Nazareth. Indeed, every nativity scene shows us Jesus together with Our Lady and St Joseph in the grotto of Bethlehem. God wanted to be born into a human family, he wanted to have a mother and father like us.

The readings focus on the importance of family. The first reading tells of the wisdom and justice in honouring parents. Respecting one's father and mother brings blessings, atonement for sins, and longevity. Caring for aging parents is a lasting act of kindness.

The second reading tells us how to live together as families. And in the gospel Joseph and Mary take the infant Jesus to Jerusalem for the ritual of purification. There they meet Simeon and Anna, who both speak about Jesus' future.

As we celebrate the Holy Family, let us remind each other that family is a vehicle of journey spirituality, that community is a *community of growth*, and that in the process of growth of the whole community each one of us plays three roles: most often that of the child, sometimes that of the father, and, unfortunately, not often enough that of the mother.

The liturgy of today's feast calls for the return to that which is basic to a community of growth, namely: care, love and a healthy respect for one another that includes

mutual correction. Let us put on this kind of kindness so that we become a true Christian families, living lives centered on God and His purposes.

catechists to their worship space where they take part in the Sunday Scripture at an age appropriate level with terminology that will assist the children to understand and appreciate the Gospel message. The children return to Mass to sit with their families after the General Intercessions to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

As a parish, we need to continue to build the various parish ministry teams: those who support the community at Sunday Masses and those who extend the Mission of the parish in the wider community.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMS 2024

Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion

If your child is in Year 3 or above, and has been Baptised, they are eligible to receive the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in our parish.

The Sacrament of First Reconciliation will be held on Friday, 22nd March 2024.

The Sacrament of First Holy Communion will be held on Sunday, 2nd June 2024.

Additional information and registrations forms will be available from the parish website mid-January 2024.

Sacraments of Confirmation

If your child is in Year 6 or above, has been Baptised and has received the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion, they are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be held on Sunday, 29th September 2024.
