REFLECTION

It is no surprise that we begin Lent with Jesus in the desert. Like his ancestors, Jesus too is tried, tested and tempted. However, Jesus refused to give up or give in so quickly or so easily. Although our gospel for this Sunday is written by St. Mark, the gospel of St. Matthew gives us more information about what might have happened to Jesus. He is tempted with the false gifts of power, prestige and wealth. His power and identity come from God. Jesus knows who he is, where he comes from and where he is going on his own journey. He leaves the desert with these powerful words which he offers us today; 'The time has come, the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.' What is this Good News that Jesus asks us to hear and believe? It is the good news that each of us is created, loved and forgiven by God.

As we begin our own Lenten journey, we need to recall and remember that we are not setting out on this journey on our own. God is with us walking by our side every step of the way. When we are tempted tested, we need to follow the example of Jesus. He did not rely on his own strength. He turned to God and

asked for help which he received. We know that God will be with us during Lent as God was with Jesus when he was in the desert. God will never leave us alone.


Sacraments of Confirmation
