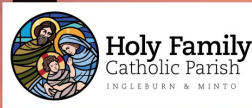

Reflection

The theme of today's readings is Mission, the call and the sending out of us and others to witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Amos in the First Reading was a sheep farmer who felt that he was called by God to preach against the social injustice that was rife in the northern kingdom of Israel. He was the first of a series of strong charismatic prophets. He appeared from Judah, when Israel was expanding, prosperous and powerful. His words were not welcome.

In the Gospel we have the story of Jesus sending out the Apostles as his missionaries, telling them to travel light, they are not to be weighed down with possessions, nor should they take money. They were to have the freedom of Amos - the freedom of the unencumbered. They have to carry the missionary word of Jesus and not to rely on their own resources but on the authority that had been given them by God and the kindness of those they met on their way.

It is the same for us. Being that vulnerable (like Amos,) makes the message a real resource and rely on the power and authority given to us in our baptism. When we are free of all our possessions then we are free to work for the Lord. Only then can we have our minds on the job of living the Christian life and bringing others to Christ. We have but to live simply, trust in Jesus and spread Jesus' message of the Good News.

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs
