Reflection by Father Henry

The readings today challenge us to rely on God as the only source of our survival for He does not only satisfy our material hunger, He equally fills us with his own life. The Word and the Eucharist thus become life-giving gifts of God to us.

The first reading from Exodus retells the provision the Lord made for the journeying Israelites following their complaint at losing the bounty of Egypt. Even though the Israelites were enslaved, they still shared in the fruits of that bounty in some ways. Being in the desert, by comparison, was a difficult experience of lack. Nevertheless, God responded to the requests of his people, however inelegantly expressed, and provided manna to sustain them.

Today's Gospel is the beginning of Jesus' long discourse on the Holy Eucharist. In John's Gospel Jesus not only gives the Bread of Life, Jesus is the Bread of Life. The **G**iver and the Gift are One and the same. As the Bread of Life from Heaven, Jesus claims that only He can satisfy man's spiritual hunger. While bodily food helps us to stay alive in this world, Spiritual Food sustains and develops our supernatural life which will last forever in Heaven. Through God's infinite love we are given, in the Blessed Eucharist, the very Author of the Gifts of Faith and Sanctifying Grace. Thus, the Eucharist is not a mere "symbol" of Jesus; rather, it is a Sacramental sign of Jesus' Real Bodily Presence in His glorified, scarred, risen Body. This Bread of Life - Who is Jesus Himself - gives mankind a new relationship with God, a relationship of trust, obedience and love.
