Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, Year B 24 November 2024

Not from, but for, the World

What are we to make of the famous reply of Jesus to Pilate: 'My kingdom is not of this world'? Left there, it sounds as though Jesus is talking about a realm which is far removed from terrestrial concerns. Perhaps our task as his followers is to meditate into a blissful nothingness, to live other-worldy lives.

It is a poor translation, and it should read: 'My kingdom is not *from* this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would have fought to stop my being handed over.' Of all the ways in which our Lord could have contrasted his realm with all the other ways in which societies are ruled, he chose a contrast about the use of force. Rather, his reign springs from his Father's will that humanity should live together in a realm of non-violence.

We can easily criticise the blasphemous use of barbaric violence in the supposed service of religion. It is the most extreme opposite of Our Lord's teaching which He embodied in his practice. But, even for us, the challenge is there to restrain too-ready resort to armed violence and to humanely moderate its exercise where it is used to protect the innocent.

We could pause for a moment to pray for the coming of the Kingdom, not as an 'out of this world' experience, but in the words of the Our Father: 'Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done *on earth* as it is in heaven.'

Holy Family goes solar

Laudato Si', Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical on the environment, has stimulated a lot of discussion in the Catholic Church over how to take up the Pope's exhortation to respond to global warming.

The encyclical provides the underlying philosophical, moral and religious impetus for churches, schools and all people of good will, especially Catholics to take concrete action.

There has been a move on the part of religious institutions, such as parishes and schools, to find ways to respond to the church's desire to extend social justice theory to our planet, and to re-

spond not just as individuals but as a community.

The Holy Family Parish and School is currently exploring a project to acquire solar panels for both the parish and school. The Parish Council and the Finance Committee has given the parish a green light to go ahead with this project. Bishop Brian and the Diocese of Wollongong are supportive of this initiative. We hope to have this project completed over this summer.


