Gospel Reflection by Father Henry

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi invites us to reflect with gratitude and wonder on the gift of the Eucharist. In today's Gospel (John 6:51-58), Jesus makes an extraordinary promise: "I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live forever." He assures us that in the Eucharist He gives us not just a symbol, but His very self, the Bread of Life who nourishes us for eternal life.



For many people, the mystery of the Real Presence can be difficult to comprehend. Yet faith allows us to trust the words of Jesus. At every Mass, under the appearances of bread and wine, Christ becomes truly present and offers Himself to us as spiritual food. The Eucharist is God's greatest gift to His Church, the sacrament through which we encounter the living Lord most intimately.

The second reading (1 Corinthians 10:16-17) reminds us that Holy Communion is not only about our personal relationship with Christ. St Paul teaches that "because there is one bread, we who are many are one body." By sharing in the one Bread, we are united not only with Christ but also with one another. The Eucharist builds the Church and calls us to live as a community of faith, love, and service.


Regular reception of Holy Communion is therefore not merely a pious practice; it is essential nourishment for Christian life. Just as our bodies need food to live, our souls need the Eucharist to grow in faith, hope, and love.

As we celebrate Corpus Christi, may we renew our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus and approach the altar with deeper reverence and gratitude, allowing this heavenly food to transform us and strengthen the bonds that make us one in Christ.

Vinnies Emergency Food Hampers and "Comfort Gifts"

Dear Parishioners,

Holy Family Vinnies is dedicated to supporting those in our community facing financial hardship, homelessness, or isolation. Your ongoing generosity helps us provide crucial assistance throughout the year.

We gratefully accept donations for:

- Non-perishable food hampers: These help individuals and families in urgent need.
- "Comfort gifts": Small gifts bring cheer to those who are lonely or cannot afford presents for children.

Donations may be placed in the plastic tubs on the table near the Piety Stall. Items are collected fortnightly and delivered to Samaritan House for distribution through the Vinnies Welfare Service at Macquarie Fields.

Suggested Donation Items:

- Pantry Staples: breakfast cereal, long-life milk, tinned spaghetti, tinned baked beans, vegetable soup, tinned tuna, tinned vegetables, tinned fruit, rice, pasta, pasta sauce.
- Treats: sweet or savoury biscuits, tea, coffee.
- Toiletries: toilet rolls, toothpaste, soap.

Important: Kindly ensure all donated items are well within their use-by date, do not require refrigeration (unless opened), and that tins have pull-top lids where possible.
